Parsons, Kansas, June 27, 2015—More than 1,600 of America's best and brightest college students traveled to the Windy City to *Step Up to the Challenge* as they showcased their talents as future business leaders and vied for the opportunity to win more than \$81,000 in cash awards.

Future Business Leaders of America-Phi Beta Lambda (FBLA-PBL), held its PBL National Leadership Conference in Chicago on June 24–27. Attending from Labette Community College were Ty Ellis, Kortney Kirkland, Orren Taylor, Shawna Yockey along with their Advisor, Cathy Kibler. Participants from across the United States attended this exciting conference to enhance their business skills, expand their networks, and participate in more than 55 business and business-related competitive events.

Kortney Kirkland, Orren Taylor and Shawna Yockey from Labette Community College in Parsons, Kansas, received national recognition at the PBL Awards of Excellence Program on June 27. These three students competed in Marketing Analysis and Decision Making and brought home seventh place. This event consisted of two parts: an objective test and a role playing activity. Only the top 15 teams advanced to the final role play component which consisted of an interactive role play situation that included competencies dealing with consumer behavior, advertising, e-commerce, public relations, marketing principles, concepts and management.
