

VEHICLE EXTRICATION **Su June 6** **8:00am-5:00pm**

This course will include vehicle preparation, vehicle placement at the scene, extrication techniques, gaining access, patient care, and disentanglement. Safety will be stressed; students must wear full protective clothing in the training area excluding SCBA.

DEFENSIVE DRIVING **Su June 6** **8:00am-5:00pm**

This course was initially developed to benefit fire, EMS and rescue chief officers, as well as safety officers, training officers and drivers of emergency vehicles. Newly revised, it is the next logical step in addressing safe emergency response after initiating a driver-training program. It is designed to reveal the dangers of emergency response and the adverse effects on emergency service organizations resulting from emergency vehicle accidents.

HALF-DAY AND ONE-DAY SESSIONS

KANSAS FLOOD AND WATER RESCUE 1 **April 26-29**

Instruction by Jeff Cox from Kansas Fire and Rescue Training Institute

This class is designed to give persons involved in water rescue base line knowledge and understanding of the effects of moving water. It will also teach the participants how to better utilize boat operations to their advantage in these rapidly changing conditions. This class will be held in late April to ensure proper water flow in our creeks and streams.

INCIDENT COMMAND OFFICERS **Th June 3** **8:00am-5:00pm**
WORKSHOP (INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEMS)

Instruction by Larry Steeby, Parsons Fire Chief

This course will cover basic incident management of emergency scenes. Class participants will interact with instructors and classmates to find common emergency scene techniques for incident management. This class will be both classroom instruction and scenario based learning for the participants. This class is designed for anyone who is expected to make command level decisions at an emergency scene.

EVERYONE GOES HOME

Instruction by Everyone Goes Home Kansas Advocate Gary Bowker

Firefighters must have the courage to face a multitude of risks in order to save lives and protect their communities. Their courage allows them to willingly risk their own lives so that others can be saved. A different type of courage is required to stay safe in potentially dangerous situations, avoiding needless risks and tragic consequences. This presentation was originally developed by the Firefighter Life Safety Initiatives Team with the assistance of many firefighters and fire officers including Chief Billy Goldfeder and John Salka. It is intended to influence the participants towards changing the attitude that firefighter deaths are a normal and acceptable outcome.

Session II is a repeat of Session I.

FIRE INSPECTION **F June 4** **8:00am-Noon**
CRITERIA – GENERAL CHECKLIST

Instruction by Amanda Yorkey, Education Consultant, State Fire Marshal's Office

This course is an introduction to the Kansas Buildings Fire Safety Handbook. It will explore the minimum level of fire safety enforced at a state level and will go

into detail on the requirements contained within the general checklist (which is applicable for all buildings in Kansas). The class will also look at procedures for conducting an inspection, ways to interact with building owners and operators, methods for following up on the inspections, and a discussion of maintaining records. Participants will receive a copy of the Kansas Buildings Fire Safety Handbook and there will be ample time for specific questions.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE TO PIPELINE EMERGENCIES **F June 4** **8:00am--Noon**

Instruction by Steve Roberts, M.Ed. - Lead Instructor Paradigm Liaison Services – on behalf of the Kansas Pipeline Association (kpa-awareness.com)

This workshop will discuss pipeline purpose and reliability, safety initiatives of the pipeline companies, damage prevention; products, hazards and characteristics; leak recognition and response and defining high consequence areas. Focus will be placed on the proper response techniques to a pipeline release to include offensive, defensive and non-intervention strategies, as well as assessing the scene, denying entry into these areas and working a coordinated effort between all emergency services through mutual aid (NIMS/ICS) and the pipeline companies. Finally, we will end the workshop with a 3-D animated scenario in an effort to bring all aspects of the program together. Electronic answering devices will be included for use in this workshop as questions will be included for those attending to answer throughout each section of the program.

DRIVER/OPERATOR: PUMPER **F June 4** **8:00am-5:00pm**
Instruction by Kevin Cruse, Parsons Fire Department

This class is intended to educate driver/operators who are responsible for operating apparatus equipped with fire pumps in their departments. This class will cover both the knowledge required to operate and the hands-on abilities to confidently perform effectively on a fire scene. The instructor has over 27 years of fire ground experience for the participants to benefit from.

SMALL FIRE DEPARTMENT TACTICS **F June 4** **8:00am-5:00pm**

Instruction by Glenn Pribbenow from the Kansas Fire and Rescue Training Institute

This course is designed to help the participant understand the challenges associated with small fire department operations. Tactics and strategies appropriate for use in incidents involving the single-company response and other small fire department operations are also presented. Topics include prioritizing strategy, tactical rules & Layman's model of firefighting strategy.

COMPUTER WORKSHOP: EXCEL **F June 4** **1:00pm-5:00pm**
Instruction by Janice George, LCC Computer Instructor

Students in this class will: learn to use toolbars; learn terminology; open, save and close a worksheet and workbook; move around the worksheet; enter data into cells; delete, edit, copy, format and save cell data, columns and rows; create formulas; change the appearance of worksheets; create, format and print graphs and charts; add header/footer to worksheet; print a worksheet; use Excel Help.

FIRE INSPECTION CRITERIA – CHILD CARE FACILITIES **F June 4** **1:00pm–5:00pm**

Instruction by Amanda Yorkey, Education Consultant, State Fire Marshal's Office

This course is an introduction to the Kansas Buildings Fire Safety Handbook. It will explore the minimum level of fire safety enforced at a state level and will go into detail on the requirements contained within the general checklist and the childcare checklist. The class will also look at the difference between a child care center, a home daycare, and a preschool in regards to the code requirements and the inspection requirements. Participants will receive a copy of the Kansas

Buildings Fire Safety Handbook and there will be ample time for specific questions.

**COMPUTER WORKSHOP: Sa June 5 8:00am-Noon
POWERPOINT**

Instruction by Janice George, LCC Computer Instructor

In this class students will: learn to use toolbars; learn terminology; open, save and close a presentation; select a design template; create title and text slides; change font size and style; insert clip art or picture; animate clip art; run an animated slide show; print a presentation in slide, outline or handout views; use PowerPoint Help.

ETHANOL FIRES Sa June 5 8:00am-5:00pm

Instruction by the Kansas State Firefighters Association

This course examines the unique nature of fires involving ethanol through a range of locations from individual vehicles, to gas stations, to truck and rail transportation and finally ethanol plants.

EMS – CPR and AED Sa June 5 8:00am-5:00pm

With FIRST AID TECHNIQUES

Instruction by Labette Health EMS

This class is designed for the entry level first responders or anyone needing to re-certify in CPR. CPR cards will be provided with class completion. This class will also count for recertification hours for EMT's and Paramedics.

KANSAS WILDFIRE TRAINING Sa June 5 8:00am-5:00pm

Instruction by the Kansas Forest Service and Kansas State University

This is an 8 hour course specific to Kansas wildland fire. Topics include wildland fire behavior, firefighter preparedness, size-up, suppression tactics, and safety.

**LP BURN TRAILER Sa June 5 1:00pm-5:00pm
And Sa June 5 6:00pm-10:00pm**

Instruction by Chad Mayberry from the Kansas Fire and Rescue Training Institute

Prerequisite: All participants planning to attend this training offered by the Kansas Fire & Rescue Training Institute shall provide evidence that they have been medically screened and fit-tested as required by OSHA 29CFR1910.134 and applicable Kansas Department of Labor standards. Each department that has participants attending needs to provide this form to the instructors at the start of the class.

This module provides an opportunity for firefighters to participate in live- burn firefighting training evolutions. These evolutions develop skills necessary to safely extinguish fire types encountered in various emergency firefighting incidents. Training comprises a classroom overview of specific evolutions that will be conducted on the training ground. Additionally, specific operational tactics related to commonly encountered hazards found at actual incidents are also reviewed. Actual evolutions will involve simulated vehicle fires, dumpster fires, petroleum fuel spill fires, and natural gas meter fires using state-of-the-art propane-fueled props.

The afternoon session is classroom followed by hands-on in the evening session. Students should sign up for both.

**VEHICLE EXTRICATION – Su June 6 8:00am-5:00pm
SEMI CAB**

Instruction by the Kansas State Firefighters Association

This course will include vehicle preparation, vehicle placement at the scene, extrication techniques, gaining access, patient care, and disentanglement. Safety

EVENING SESSIONS

FIREMAN'S RELIEF ASSOCIATION Th June 3 6:00pm-10:00pm

Instruction by the Kansas State Firefighters Association

This class will cover paperwork associated with properly reporting relief activity to the state along with important new updates to this reporting. Every department should have at least one individual that needs to attend this class. It will also explore the roles of those elected to head each departments relief funds. The class will also touch on what are proper expenditures for your relief association.

FIREHOUSE SOFTWARE Th June 3 6:00pm-10:00pm

Instruction by Larry Steeby, Parsons Fire Chief

Fire incident reporting is now required to be computer generated. This would be an excellent time: 1) For beginners to learn about the software and 2) For those who have been using the software to learn more about how you can use their other software packages in conjunction with the incident reporting.

VEHICLE FIRE PRACTICES F June 4 6:00pm-10:00pm

Instruction by the Kansas State Firefighters Association

Car fires! No big deal! That's what you think! Still using a booster line or red line to extinguish those car fires? It's not always a good idea! Learn why with this course. We go from classroom to actual extinguishment of cars.

TESTING SESSION

FIT TESTING F June 4 8:00am-5:00pm

Performed by the S.E.K. Fire Chiefs

The Respiratory Protection -- OSHA Standard 1910.134 requires that those using respiratory protection, self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) be fit tested annually and a medical evaluation or screening performed. The Kansas Fire & Rescue Training Institute adheres to this federal mandate and therefore sponsors fit testing and furnishes the resources for performing these tests.

The medical evaluation or screening required by OSHA and the Kansas Department of Labor can be performed by local medical health professionals to meet the requirements of fit testing.

The S.E.K. Fire Chiefs Association is providing this service for everyone that will take any Kansas Fire & Rescue Training Institute class requiring SCBA. Everyone to be fit tested must be clean shaven - that means **NO** goatees, beards and/or long sideburns - **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Testing is offered throughout the day; normally each test takes about 15-20 minutes.
