

Homicide Investigations: Exploring the "BTK" Killings

Lt. Landwehr will give his first-person experiences of tracking and eventually capturing one of America's most notorious serial killers, Dennis Radar ("Bind Torture Kill"), who terrorized Wichita for over 30 years.

Lt. Landwehr joined the Wichita Police Department in 1978 and has served as Commander of Homicide since 1992. He has supervised over 600 homicide investigations. He currently teaches undergraduate and graduate level courses in homicide investigation at WSU. He has taught Death Investigation throughout Kansas for the past 18 years to law enforcement. He is the Director of Mid-States Homicide Investigators Association.

Kidnapping Investigations

This class will cover kidnappings and abductions. It will help the law enforcement officer articulate what kind of abduction may have taken place and assist the LEO in preparing a course of action which might best achieve a desirable resolution. Additionally the LEO will be presented with skills which might assist them as a first responder to an abduction. At the conclusion of this course the student should be able to articulate between a stranger abduction, a non-custodial family member abduction, and a hostage/non-hostage scenario. The LEO should be able to identify indicators which place a scenario at a high risk of a homicide suicide.
