



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### 1.0 Department Summary

The Student Success Center (SSC) houses Academic Accessibility & Support, Adult Education, Advising, Case Management, TRIO Student Support Services (SSS), and Testing services. The breadth of services located within the SSC benefits from a cross-divisional reporting structure, with Adult Education reporting to the Vice President of Academic Affairs and all other units reporting to the Vice President of Student Affairs. This shared structure promotes strong collaboration and coordinated support for students.

### **Staffing and Collaborative Funding Model**

Historically, the SSC has tracked academic support, testing, and TRIO Student Support Services (SSS), reflecting the Director's dual role in overseeing both the SSC and the SSS program. The Center's staffing model demonstrates substantial collaboration between the College and the SSS grant. The SSC Director is a full-time employee funded 90% by—and time-committed to—the SSS grant, with the remaining 10% funded by the College to provide oversight of testing services. The SSC Associate is also a full-time position, with 85% of their time dedicated to testing services and 15% supported by the SSS grant. In addition, the SSS program employs two full-time, grant-funded academic advisors who provide comprehensive support to eligible participants.

This blended staffing model has maximized resources and strengthened alignment between SSC functions and SSS grant requirements. At the same time, federally mandated priorities for the SSS grant have limited the Center's capacity to expand services beyond grant-required activities. The sustained growth of testing services has also increased the operational demands placed on the SSC Associate. Additionally, because the SSC building houses multiple units that do not all report through the SSC organizational structure, the shared physical space has occasionally contributed to campus confusion about the delineation of responsibilities. Even so, the collaborative funding structure and co-located services continue to support efficient operations and facilitate coordinated student support.

### **Academic Coordination and Position Restructuring**

Academic coordination services underwent an important transition during AY2025. Prior to the 2025–2030 SSS grant cycle, the SSC and SSS jointly supported a 50/50 Academic Coordinator who advised SSS students and oversaw college-wide tutoring and academic support. When the SSS grant was resubmitted and refunded in 2025, the .5 FTE portion of this position was removed from the grant, and the role transitioned to being fully college-funded. At the same time, LCC experienced a rapid increase in accommodation requests. In response, the College strategically restructured the existing position into the Academic Accessibility Manager, expanding its responsibilities to include ADA accommodations in addition to tutoring and broader academic support services. This restructured position now reports directly to the Vice President of Student Affairs.

For AY2023–25, data related to tutoring and academic support are included in this report, while ADA-related data appear in the Adult Education report. Moving forward, the Academic Accessibility Manager will compile and report comprehensive data for both areas through established annual and program review processes.


### 1.1 Quantitative and Qualitative Data

### **Testing Data**

SSC testing services include:

- Exam makeups
- Placement testing
- Proctoring for online courses
- Testing for students with accommodations
- Proctoring for students enrolled at other institutions
- Occasional CLEP and CNA examinations

The SSC has seen a significant increase in scheduled appointments over the last three years. To support this growth, LCC expanded testing capacity in 2025 by adding two additional testing rooms, bringing the total number of testing rooms in the SSC to five.

### **Key Observations:**

### 1. Growth in overall testing volume

Scheduled appointments have risen steadily, indicating sustained and increasing student need for testing support.

### 2. Increased demand for accommodated testing

Staff observations indicate that many accommodated testing appointments require extended time

and specialized environments, contributing to longer room occupancy and greater scheduling complexity.

### 3. Rising demand for Accuplacer testing among non-LCC students

Qualitative data show a surge in requests from PSU students seeking Accuplacer scores for the College of Education, placing additional strain on SSC capacity.


### 4. Higher-than-documented total appointment requests

Staff report that appointment modifications, phone requests, and walk-in inquiries suggest demand exceeds what is captured in scheduled appointment data.

### **Tutoring and Academic Support Data**

Academic support data is tracked through the Student Access database. The data as collected over this three-year period illustrate several evolving trends:

### 1. Shift from peer tutoring to professional tutoring:



Over the last three years, peer tutoring declined due primarily to the phase-out of tutoring support in athletic study halls after AY23. During that year, study hall staffing produced meaningful engagement with student-athletes including:




As study hall tutoring concluded, more academic support was provided by professional tutors and LCC staff. While more costly (peer tutor pay is  $^{510/hr}$ ; professional tutor pay is  $^{515-25/hr}$ ), this transition reflects a higher level of specialized academic assistance available to all LCC students.

### 2. Shift in tutoring modalities:

Data from AY23 show that most tutoring sessions occurred in person, with fewer than 5% taking place by phone or Zoom. All remote sessions that year were handled by professional tutors or staff.




AY24 and AY25 show a growing use of tutoring by Zoom, expanding access for students who require flexibility—especially rural students and those balancing work or family obligations. Remote tutoring has proven particularly beneficial for low-income and geographically distant students who may not be able to travel to campus on non-class days.



### 3. Shift in peer tutor availability:

AY25 data reflect a continued decline in the peer tutor pool due to graduation and tutor licensure, with some individuals moving into professional tutor roles. This shift indicates both tutor career progression and continued need for professional academic support.

Moving forward, tutoring documentation practices will be standardized to support more consistent year-over-year comparisons and improve strategic planning.



### **TRIO Student Support Services Data**

The TRIO SSS program continues to demonstrate strong outcomes and remains a key component of the SSC's academic and student success services. During the reporting period:

- SSS exceeded the federal objectives for students in Good Academic Standing.
- SSS doubled the targets for graduation, certificate attainment, and transfer.

### 2.0 Department Support of Student Success

The SSC's testing, tutoring, technology access, and TRIO services play an essential role in advancing student success and supporting the College's broader commitment to academic excellence and equitable access.

Testing services provide students with flexible and reliable options for completing course assessments, including exam make-ups, placement testing for program admission and appropriate course placement, and proctoring for online courses. The SSC also administers specialized testing, such as ADA-accommodated exams and proctoring for students from other institutions, ensuring that testing needs are met promptly and professionally across a wide range of academic requirements. These services reduce the burden on faculty, streamline assessment processes, and help students progress through their academic pathways without delay.

Compliance with Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act further ensures that students with disabilities have equitable access to academic evaluations. By coordinating accommodated testing, extended time, reduced-distraction environments, and other approved supports, the SSC reinforces LCC's commitment to creating an inclusive and accessible learning environment.

Tutoring services, delivered through in-person, online, and remote modalities, provide individualized academic support that strengthens persistence, course completion, and overall academic achievement. Expanded access to tutoring via Zoom has been especially critical for rural, working, and low-income students, who may face logistical or transportation barriers that limit their ability to seek help on campus. These services contribute to improved academic confidence, stronger study habits, and greater long-term success.

The SSC provides access to essential academic resources for LCC students, including desktop computers, free printing, study carrels, tutoring spaces, and shared meeting areas. These supports are particularly valuable for students who may lack reliable technology or quiet study environments at home. Collectively, these resources promote engagement, foster academic readiness, and help students stay connected to the support structures that underpin educational success.

### 3.0 Department Outcomes

The central goal of the Student Success Center is to provide academic and testing support to all LCC students. This goal is advanced through a variety of academic assistance modalities, including individual and group tutoring sessions and in person or virtual appointments. While services are coordinated through the SSC, some supports such as athletic study hall tutoring were provided in other locations due to space limitations. Students receiving ADA accommodations such as test readers and extended test taking time schedule testing through the SSC, as do those students scheduling make up exams. The SSC also serves as a proctoring site for certain online LCC courses and for area students completing coursework at other colleges and universities.

The SSC's testing services reduce the burden on faculty by supporting make-up assessments and coordinating alternate testing arrangements for students with accommodations. In addition to increasing convenience and consistency, private testing rooms are essential for students receiving testing accommodations.

Testing and Academic Support Services have experienced significant growth over the past three years. The rising number of LCC students qualifying for accommodations is expected to drive sustained growth in testing appointments over the foreseeable future.

TRIO SSS also contributes significantly to student success by providing targeted academic support to identified, eligible students to improve academic persistence and rates of Good Academic Standing among at-risk populations at LCC. These services, fully funded by the U.S. Department of Education, are monitored year-round and detailed in the program's annual performance report to the Department each Fall. These reports consistently substantiate the positive impact of the SSS program on the eligible students it serves.

### 3.1 Significant Impacts

The testing services offered by the SSC benefit both faculty and students by increasing flexibility for testing make-up exams for students and reducing the time burden on faculty. The SSC provides placement testing for students enrolling at LCC as well as those who require Accuplacer scores for entry into LCC programs as well as the Education program at Pittsburg State University.

Testing services for students receiving accommodations are required to remain in compliance with Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. These services ensure that all students have equitable access and that the campus remains inclusive to students with disabilities.

Providing academic support for athletic study halls has been a mutually-beneficial partnership between the SSDC and Athletics, ensuring student-athletes regular access to academic support despite demanding course, practice, and travel schedules.

Online tutoring further expanded access to academic supports to off-campus and non-traditional students. This modality has proven especially valuable for our rural and low-income, allowing them to receive support at home without having to drive to campus to receive academic support.

The Debbie Groff Book Loan program, managed by the Student Success Center Director, continues to reduce the cost of attendance for LCC students by allowing students to borrow commonly-used general education course textbooks for the semester.

Despite the lack of 100% time-committed employees, the Student Success Center continues to play a central role in providing support for both students and faculty at Labette Community College.

### 4.0 External Constituency and Significant Trends

The Student Success Center provides limited testing services for non-LCC students, including proctoring exams for community members living locally but taking online coursework at other colleges and universities. Recently, requests from Pittsburg State University students requiring Accuplacer test scores for admission into the College of Education have increased rapidly. Although administering Accuplacer testing carries administrative costs, LCC historically did not charge non-LCC students for this service. However, the recent surge in requests from students with no intention to enroll at LCC has placed increased strain on existing proctoring capacity.

In response, the SSC has implemented changes to ensure sustainability and equitable service delivery. These changes include assessing a testing session fee for non-LCC examinees and limiting Accuplacer availability for this population to scheduled group testing sessions offered at the Main Campus and Cherokee Center.

In contrast, proctoring requests for online coursework from other institutions typically involve only a small number of students each semester and continue to require minimal administrative support. As such, this remains a free service to community members, and there are no current plans to implement a fee for this purpose.

The Student Success Center also provides physical space and access to College resources such as phone lines and computers to the Stella Wells Christmas Basket program each year. This partnership supports an important community initiative that serves food-insecure individuals in the Parsons area and reflects LCC's broader commitment to community engagement and service.

### **5.0 Department Success**

The SSC Director used testing session data to support an expansion of the testing center from three testing rooms to five. Prior to March 2020, each testing room contained two testing stations; however, the second station was removed during the pandemic, effectively cutting capacity in half. As LCC's enrollment grew and the number of students requiring testing accommodations increased, the SSC no longer had sufficient capacity to meet proctoring demands. As a result of the usage study, three new offices were created in the SSC during the summer of 2025. This renovation allowed current personnel to shift offices, freeing three additional rooms: two of which were designated as testing spaces and one which was designated as a shared workspace. The shared workspace provides space for community partners to set up and meet with LCC students and, when not in use for that purpose, serves as a collaborative study space.

The SSC provides open computer lab space and free printing for students and community members. During the remodel, three computer stations were removed and dividers and charging stations were added to provide workspace for students with laptops. The SSC also continues to provide physical space and access to College resources to the Stella Wells Christmas Baskets program to serve the needs of food-insecure persons in the Parsons community.

TRIO SSS project staff college compile student data relating to retention, academic success, degree progress and completion throughout the year to evaluate intervention effectiveness and track progress toward standardized objectives approved by the US Department of Education. These data consistently demonstrate that the SSS program meets or exceeds its federally approved targets, with participants achieving strong rates of persistence, retention, Good Academic Standing, completion, and transfer, often surpassing program benchmarks and significantly outperforming expected outcomes for comparable atrisk student populations.

### 5.1 Staff Accomplishments

The greatest accomplishment of the Student Success Center staff can be seen in the significant growth of its programming and services. Originally a part-time Academic Coordinator position, the new Academic Accessibility Manager position reflects the growth in academic support to LCC students. The position is now managed directly by the Vice President of Student Affairs but would not have been possible without the efforts of the part-time Academic Coordinator while balancing their duties to the TRIO Student Support Services grant.

The Student Success Center Associate plays an essential role in ensuring that students are connected to the support they need as soon as they enter the SSC. In addition to greeting students, answering phones, proctoring exams, and processing TRIO SSS applications, the Associate accepts referrals, provides FAFSA assistance to current and prospective students, and manages the equipment loan service for LCC students. From May through September 2025, the SSC and SSS programs operated with only two full-time employees. During this period of reduced staffing, increased volume, and heightened operational pressure, the SSC Associate provided exceptional support to the Director and helped sustain the delivery of core SSC services. The Associate's professionalism, flexibility, and willingness to take on additional responsibilities were instrumental in maintaining service continuity and meeting student needs during a critical time.

The Student Success Center Director balanced committee participation with oversight of testing and tutoring services and administration of the TRIO SSS grant throughout the review period. A major project during this time was the authorship and submission of the TRIO Student Support Services grant proposal, which secured approximately \$1.5 million in federal funding for 2025–2030. This funding will support continued delivery of academic, financial literacy, and persistence-focused services for eligible students. The review period also included significant federal changes affecting TRIO programs, requiring close monitoring of evolving regulations and adjustments to program administration. In 2025, the Director collaborated with the Director of Advising to refine advising practices at LCC and to develop and launch advisor training modules for new hires in the Advising Center.

### **Supervising Administrator Response**

The Student Success Center's leadership and staff consistently demonstrate a strong commitment to student success, collaboration, and continuous improvement at Labette Community College. This review clearly illustrates how the SSC has adapted to meet growing student needs across testing, tutoring, academic accessibility, technology access, and TRIO Student Support Services. The thoughtful use of quantitative and qualitative data to guide decisions, particularly in expanding testing capacity and restructuring positions to better support ADA accommodations, reflects a student-centered and responsible approach to resource management.

I want to acknowledge the significant leadership contributions of the SSC Director during this review period. Her authorship and submission of the TRIO Student Support Services grant proposal resulted in nearly \$1.5 million in federal funding for 2025–2030. This achievement will directly benefit LCC students for years to come. She also navigated substantial federal changes impacting TRIO programs and maintained steady, student-focused program administration throughout a period of uncertainty. Her collaboration with the Advising Center to strengthen advising practices and develop advisor training resources has further improved our institutional capacity to support students.

I also want to recognize the exceptional work of the SSC Associate, who played a crucial role in maintaining service continuity during months when the SSC and SSS programs operated with only two full-time employees. Her willingness to assume additional responsibilities, assist with all aspects of SSC and SSS operations, manage testing needs, and remain a steady point of contact for students reflect a high level of professionalism and care. The Associate's contributions ensured that students continued to receive timely assistance during a particularly challenging period.

The high level of collaboration evident throughout this report is noteworthy. The SSC has worked effectively with Academic Affairs, Athletics, Case Management, Academic Advising, TRIO SSS, community partners, and external institutions to expand access and improve outcomes for students. These partnerships help ensure that students receive coordinated, seamless support that aligns with their academic and personal goals.

It is important to note that many of the accomplishments detailed in this review were achieved during a period of limited staffing capacity. The ability of the SSC to maintain services, and in several areas expand them, speaks directly to the dedication, resourcefulness, and professionalism of the staff. The strong persistence, retention, academic standing, completion, and transfer outcomes achieved by TRIO SSS participants further highlight the Center's positive impact on student success.

The Student Success Center remains a central part of the College's support infrastructure. I appreciate the work of Director Robinson and her team, and I am grateful for their continued commitment to LCC students and to the mission of the College.
