COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Jewelry Making is an excellent activity for hand/eye coordination, finger dexterity, and stress relief. In this hands-on course, students will explore the world of jewelry making while creating five or six pieces of jewelry and learning the basics of jewelry design and materials, color theory, and different media and techniques used in the making of jewelry.

COURSE OUTCOMES AND COMPETENCIES:

Students who successfully complete this course will be able to:

1. Produce five or six pieces of professionally-finished beaded jewelry using different materials
 - Wire of different gauges and what gauge of wire is used for each piece of jewelry
 - Using leather in jewelry
 - Bead stringing
 - Wire wrapping
 - Constructing jewelry links to form a chain
2. Understand the basics of quality jewelry design.
 - Use basic beading skills comfortably
 - Use four techniques to create beaded jewelry that will last and be comfortable to wear

- Explore the different techniques used to make jewelry.
- Use color and design techniques to create eye-catching, artistic pieces.
