In this class the students will be shown some best practices for setting up a fire engine at a rural structure fire with no secured water supply. This class will get the students hands on training with drafting operations, hand line deployment, and narrow farm lane water supply.

**RAPID INTERVENTION****Th May 31 8:00am-5:00 pm****Instruction by Tony Cozzo, Coffeyville F.D.**

A downed firefighter is every department's worst nightmare. One thing history has taught us is that Rapid Intervention is not rapid, having crews trained to accomplish this mission can be the difference between a close call and tragedy. Rapid Intervention demands that your crews be proficient in every aspect of firefighting, from thermal imager use, to proficient truck work, to being able to think and improvise under pressure. This class will rotate crews through several skill stations and culminate with a real time scenario at the end to test your crew's mettle.

**DRIVING SIMULATOR TRAINING****Th May 31 8:00am-5:00pm****New classes on F June 1 8:00am-5:00pm****New classes on S June 2 8:00am-5:00pm****Instruction by Kansas Fire and Rescue Training Institute, University of Kansas**

This training utilizes simulators to reinforce good driving skills and mediate the correct response to a driving situation. Situations are repeatable until the desired skill is learned without endangering students or damaging equipment. The simulator contains all of the functions and controls needed for conducting driver training.

**KANSAS WILDLAND FIREFIGHTING****Th May 31 1:00-5:00pm****New class on Th May 31 6:00-10:00pm****Instruction by Rodney Redinger, Kansas Forest Service**

From the hardwoods in the east, to the grass and sagebrush of the southwest, Kansas has a wide variety of fuels and topography. This course cuts across those boundaries and takes you through all aspects of wild land firefighting. Learn to recognize fuel, weather and topography conditions and the early warning signs of extreme fire behavior. The course also covers water conservation, fire ground safety and suppression tactics with an emphasis on fine fuels. A good course for Kansas firefighters at all levels.

**FIRST IN DECISIONS FOR** **Th May 31 6:00-10:00pm**  
**FIRST-IN OFFICERS** **New class on F June 1 6:00-10:00pm**  
**Captain Chad Menard, Rogersville, Alabama Fire Department**

When the tones drop and you're the First-In Firefighter will you be ready? This class is dedicated to preparing firefighters of all ranks and all department sizes for the first few key moments on the fire ground. We don't care if you see seven fires a year, seventy fires a year, a county fire department or a city fire department; we want to give you the tools necessary to put the troops to work and get things done. This is a very interactive class with lots of student participation with scenarios that are based around scene size-ups, command, reading smoke, building construction, engine work, truck work, and shows the importance of situational awareness, a good 360, and a quick thorough search based off of real world incidents from the last 14 years. If you're wanting to hone your skills for the right front seat this class is for you!

The topics will be health, safety and First Responder mental fitness. Tim Millsbaugh, Director of the Firefighter Cancer Support Network of Kansas, will do a presentation on cancer and Chief Jim Bodenheimer will do one on preparing personnel mentally for crisis situations, then the discussion will proceed from there.

**WHERE YOUR BUGLE STARTS** **F June 1 8:00am-Noon**  
**Instruction by Jeff Deal, McPherson Fire Chief**

This course will explore the process of developing your intellect for becoming a fire officer. We will be reviewing the four core courses of the fire officer program offered by Hutchinson CC. We will be taking excerpts from each course to help develop a deeper understanding of the role and responsibility of the fire officer.

We will be exploring an Introduction to Fire Administration, Fire Officer I and II as well as an Interpersonal Dynamics course material. The course is intended for the up and coming company officer as well as the seasoned veteran. No books are required but we will be working directing out of the HCC material. If you think you have what it takes to lead then you know already how critical it is to be educated on how to lead. This course will start you on that process or reiterate material you have already been exposed to.

This course will provide training for firefighters and fire officers on the role and responsibilities of the Incident Safety Officer and will allow participants to practice some of the key skills needed for competency as an Incident Safety Officer at different incidents that a department may respond to such as structure fires, motor vehicle fires, extrications, etc. The course will assist in meeting the requirements of NFPA 1500, 'Standard for Fire Department Occupational Safety and Health Program', NFPA 1521, 'Standard for Fire Department Safety Officer' and OSHA 29CFR 1910.120 'Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response'.

**Instruction by the Wichita F.O.O.L.S. of Oz**

Real experience, real fire conditions, real techniques and real fun. This class is a hands on, drag hose, spray water, ask questions course in full turnouts and

The instructor will take you through the areas that responders need to be familiar with and to prepare you to go on-line and take the certification tests for each level.

**Instruction by Kansas Fire and Rescue Training Institute, University of Kansas**

This course is designed for entry level firefighters to help them gain confidence in using a self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA.) Students will be given a quick review of SCBA parts and functions, including donning the SCBA. They will participate in search and rescue scenarios to build confidence in the equipment they use and their ability to operate in confined spaces. Training involves the use of the Kansas Fire & Rescue Training Institute's Search & Rescue Simulator. Participants must furnish their own PPE including SCBA and have an up-to-date fit test.

You have experienced a traumatic event or critical incident; even though the event may be over, you may now be experiencing (or may experience later) some strong emotional or physical reactions. It is very common, in fact quite normal, for people to experience emotional aftershocks when they have passed through a horrible event.

Sometimes the emotional aftershocks appear immediately after the event; sometimes they may appear a few hours or a few days later. And in some cases, weeks or months may pass before the stress reactions appear.

The signs and symptoms of a stress reaction may last a few days, a few weeks, a few months or longer, depending on the severity of the traumatic event.

The understanding and support of loved ones usually cause the stress reactions to pass more quickly. Occasionally, the event is so painful that professional assistance may be necessary; this simply indicates that the particular event was too powerful for the person to manage by him or herself.

### **FIT TESTING**

#### **Performed by the S.E.K. Fire Chiefs**

The Respiratory Protection OSHA Standard 1910.134 requires that those using respiratory protection, self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) be fit tested annually, and a medical evaluation or screening be performed. The Kansas Fire & Rescue Training Institute adheres to this federal mandate by sponsoring fit testing and furnishing the resources for performing these tests.

The medical evaluation or screening required by OSHA and the Kansas Department of Labor should be performed by local medical health professionals to meet the requirements of fit testing.

The S.E.K. Fire Chiefs Association will provide this service for everyone taking a Kansas Fire & Rescue Training Institute class requiring SCBA. Everyone to be fit tested must be clean shaven - **NO** goatees, beards and/or long sideburns - **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

***Fire department chiefs may sign off on an individual firefighter's registration form if the firefighter has been fit tested within the last 12 months.***

**>>>Each test takes about 15-20 minutes.**
