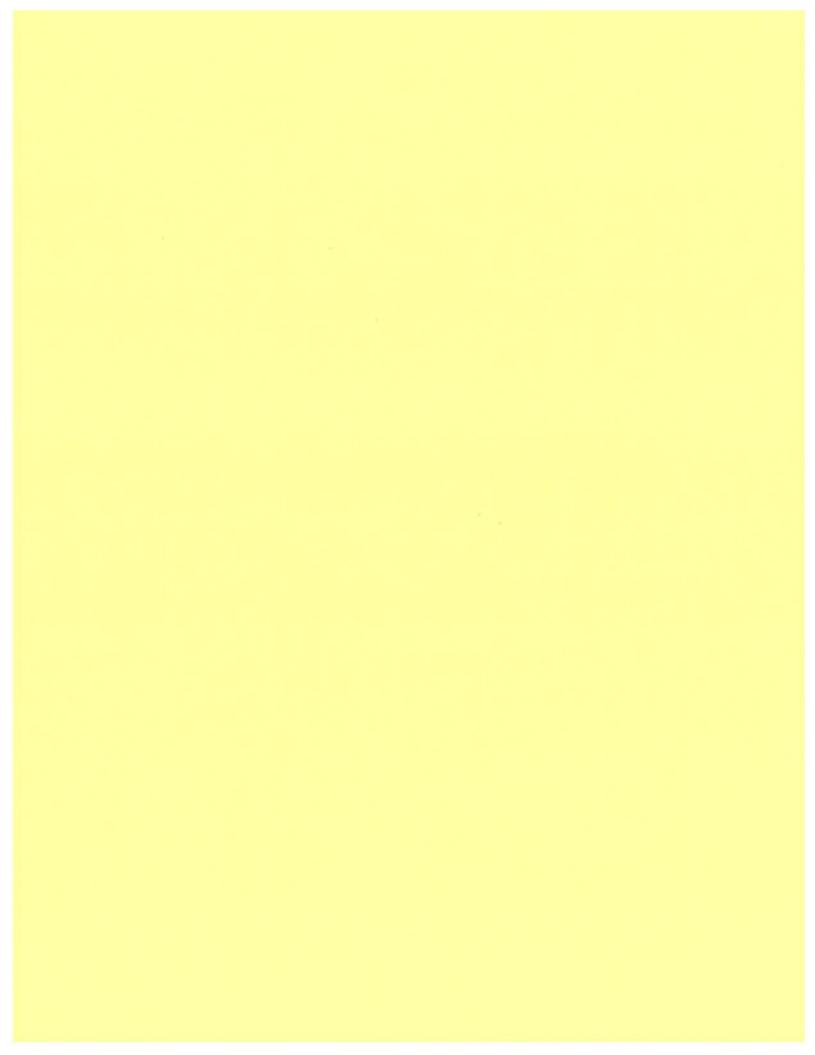
Part of the Board's responsibility is to maintain oversight on the quality of the academic and administrative programs and services. This has been an on-going feature of our regular Board meetings.

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## **Executive Summary**

(Include the major changes from previous program review.)

The purpose of a five year Program Review is to determine the viability and quality of a particular program and institute a process to provide better service to our students and supporting constituency. The Program Review committee recommended to maintain the current art program.

Program Review committee members included the lead faculty as well as other faculty, staff, and the Dean of Instruction. Program data was collected and analyzed for program relevance, quality, and effectiveness.

The committee reviewed progress from the previous Program Review and determined previous recommendations were satisfied. These included building improvements and an improved Art Department web presence.

The committee identified Art Program strengths which include a fiscally viable program, properly credentialed faculty, and support for the comprehensive community college mission, and up-to-date art equipment. The Art Department moved to the Hughes building, making the Art Program a more attractive draw for potential art students and providing a more up-to-date, attractive setting for classes. Finally, the Art Department instructor and students offer after school and summer programs for elementary art students.

Taking advantage of these opportunities and building upon the strengths of the Art Department should increase student enrollment in the Art Program and as a natural result, increase graduation numbers with art as a major emphasis.

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## ACADEMIC PROGRAM/DISCIPLINE REVIEW Labette Community College

### **Introduction to Program**

The Associate of Arts in Art is designed for transfer to a four-year institution. The program is the appropriate first step toward the study of art, art history, art marketing, art business, or art education at a four-year institution. The degree can also prepare a student for immediate work in the field.

## A. Program Relation to College Mission, Core Values, and Strategic Plan

The LCC Art Department seeks to provide quality learning opportunities to LCC students by providing qualified instructors with appropriate degrees to teach courses within the program. Program faculty utilize various methods of instruction (online courses, incorporating computer technology, projects, discussion, etc.) to prepare LCC students for transfer and the workplace. The LCC Art Department is dedicated to the goal of strengthening student art knowledge and abilities. The purpose of art courses, as stated in General Program Outcomes is to provide students with a means to:

- \* Demonstrate an understanding of the terminology and conventions of visual expression.
- \* Critically interpret and analyze works of art in terms of form and content.
- \* Demonstrate an understanding of art practices, meaning, values, and methods within historical and cultural contexts.
- \* Participate in the discourse of current visual arts culture.

LCC's curriculum is designed for transfer to four-year programs in various art related fields at regent's universities in Kansas.

### C. Program/Discipline Demand/Need

<u>Craft and fine artists</u>: Overall employment of craft and fine artists is projected to grow 8 percent from 2016 to 2026, about as fast as the average for all occupations. Employment growth for artists depends in large part on the overall state of the economy and whether people are willing to spend money on art, because people usually make art purchases when they can afford to spend the money.

Art and design: Employment of art and design occupations is projected to grow 5 percent from 2016 to 2026, about as fast as the average for all occupations, adding about 41,100 new jobs. More workers will be needed to meet the growing demand for animation and

visual effects in video games, movies, television, and on smartphones, as well as to help create visually appealing and effective layouts of websites and other media platforms. The median annual wage for art and design occupations was \$44,410 in May 2016, which was higher than the median annual wage for all occupations of \$37,040.

Teachers: Employment of high school teachers is projected to grow 8 percent from 2016 to 2026, about as fast as average for all occupations. Rising student enrollment should increase demand for high school teachers, but employment growth will vary by region. Employment growth for public high school teachers may depend on state and local government budgets. If state and local governments experience budget deficits, school boards may lay off employees, including teachers. As a result, employment growth of high school teachers may be reduced by state and local government budget deficits. Conversely, budget surpluses at the state and local level could lead to additional employment growth for high school teachers.

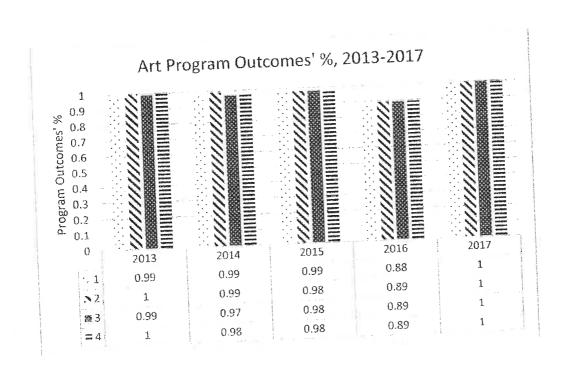

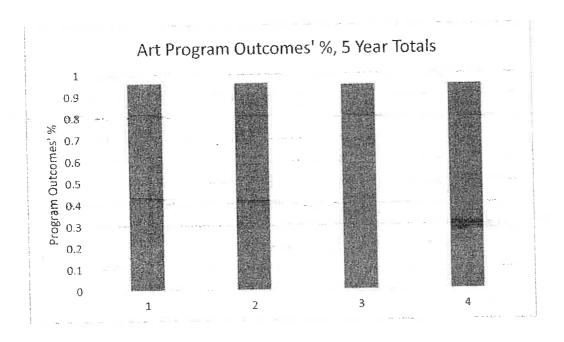

## Are the learning resources adequate for the program/discipline teaching needs? Please provide comments.

Yes, especially after the move to the Hughes building. The new facility is more attractive, safe, comfortable and up to date. The kiln room is safer with better designed kiln and room venting, and able to be locked to keep people away from kilns while they are firing. The clay mixing area has much better dust ventilation.

- \*Remove the carpet in rooms H109 and H102; due to ceramic classroom dust being tracked onto the carpet in H102 (office); and the spilling and dropping of paint on the carpet in H109. Replace carpet with tile.
- \*Create a pass-through between H103 and H109 to create a larger ceramics classroom and allow more enrollment. We have student storage for 30 students in ceramics but only seating for 15. The best location for said pass-through is probably through H106. Note: carpet must be removed for H109 to be used for ceramics due to dust.
- \* Purchase a few more potter's wheels for ceramics, we currently do not have enough, we
- \* We could use some new tables in H109 to replace the older folding models we are using.

## K. Partnerships

## To what extent has the program/discipline developed external partnerships?

Area-wide-every spring we partner with the graphic design department and 13 area high schools for our high school art show. An average of 150 high school students come on campus for one day in April and attend this event yearly. Locally- LCC current and former students serve as assistant instructors in the Jr. Cards painting and ceramic classes. In 2017, the Art Department partnered with former LCC coach and teacher, Jody Thompson; and Parsons elementary school counselor, Lou Stine, to offer a Jr. Cardinals painting class for 7-12 year olds for the first time. We enrolled 15 students in this painting course and the students had a very positive experience at LCC. Statewide we partner in the Kansas core outcomes group and have attended almost every meeting since inception.

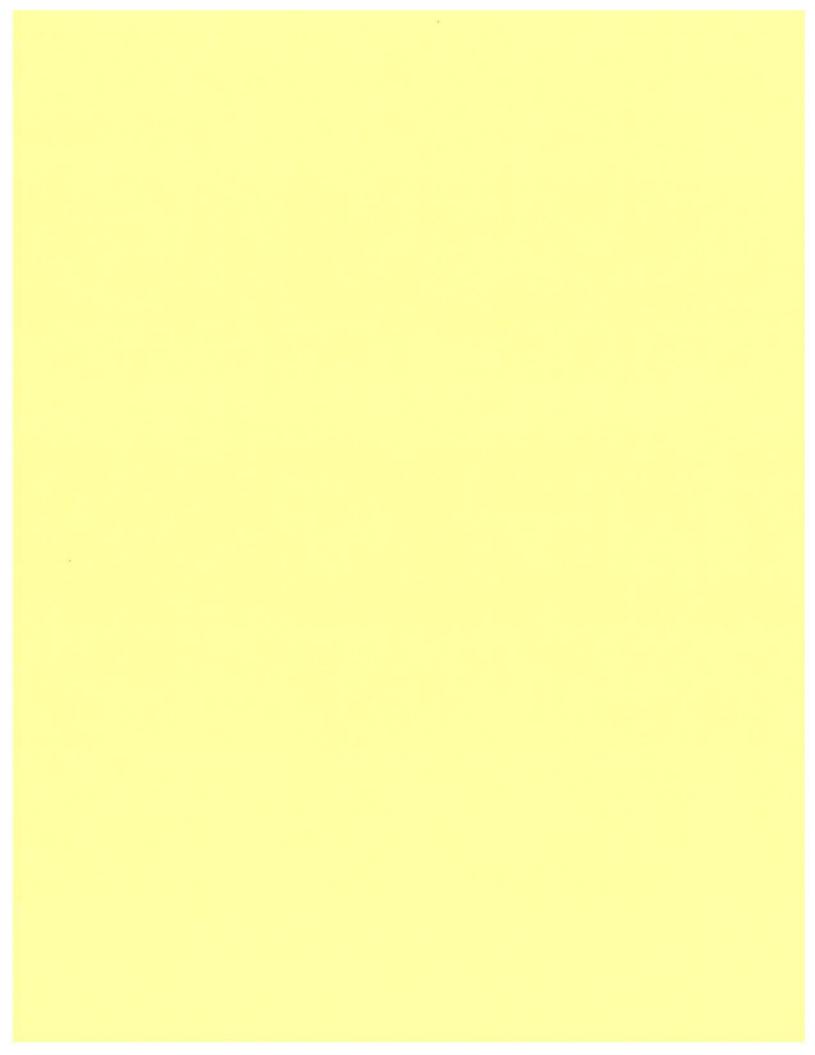

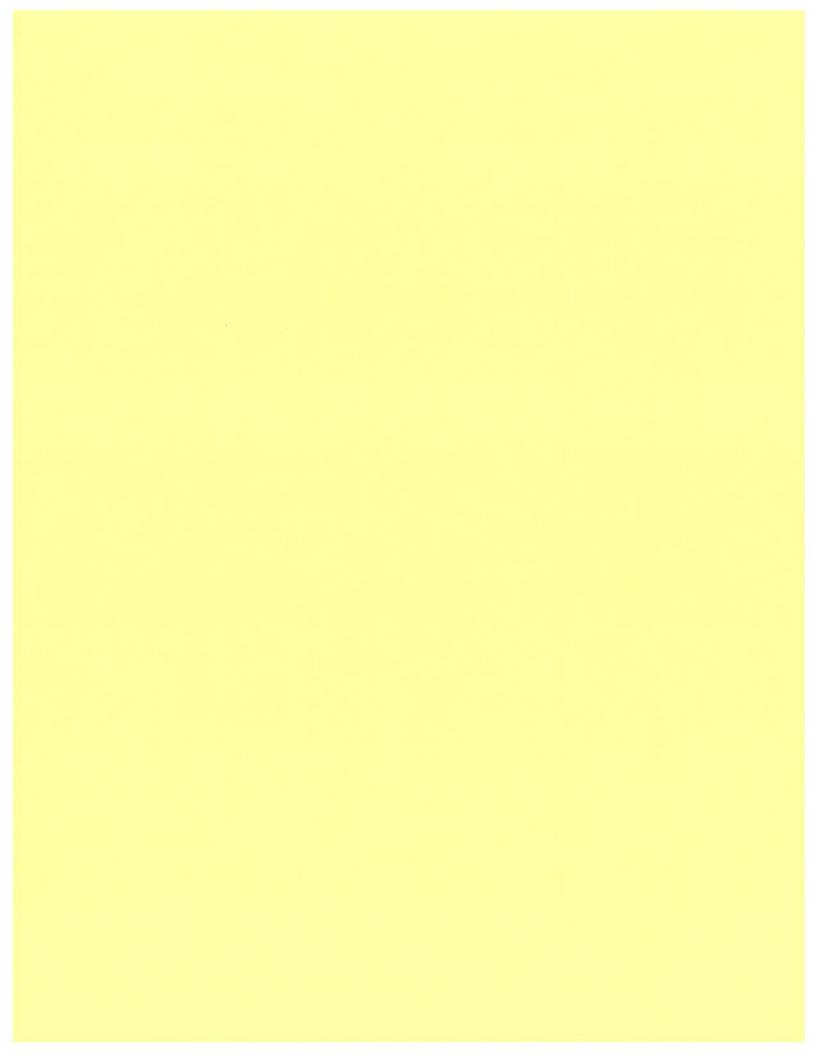
