Executive Summary

This will be the first program review for Diagnostic Medical Sonography (DMS) program. This program was one of three new programs that were added with the Title III Grant. The first cohort of students began in Fall 2011.

The purpose of the DMS program is to provide skills necessary for graduates to gain employment as entry-level sonographers. Upon completion of the program, graduates are prepared to sit for four registry exams required for entry-level sonographers. For greater success, the curriculum has been structured so that students begin taking the exams as soon as they have met the requirements. This allows them to complete at least two of the exams while still enrolled in the program.

The DMS program is unique among programs offered at LCC in that students who are accepted into the program must have already earned at least an Associate's degree in an accredited Health Care program. To date, 100% of the students who have been admitted to the DMS program have earned that credential at LCC. As will be demonstrated later in this review, this prior success results in high retention and graduation rates.

The biggest challenge for the DMS program is the enrollment cap imposed by the Kansas Board of Regents. When LCC was approved to offer this certificate, the enrollment for this certificate program was limited to ten students per cohort.

The DMS program is growing but has not quite reached full capacity. However, progress is being made. In addition, an advanced training opportunity has been added. The DMS program director developed, and is now offering, an on-line echocardiography course. This course was developed to provide practicing sonographers an opportunity to gain advanced skills and sit for an additional registry exam.

It is the recommendation of the Program Review Committee that the Diagnostic Medical Sonography program be continued.

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ACADEMIC PROGRAM/DISCIPLINE REVIEW Labette Community College

Introduction to Program

The first cohort of students in the Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program began classes in Fall 2011. Initial funding for the DMS program was obtained through the Title III Grant (Federal grant program to improve education). Grant funding for this program ended in October 2013. The Kansas Board of Regents Technical Education Authority approved LCC's Sonography program for only ten students and seven clinical sites.

The LCC Diagnostic Medical Sonography Program is one of three accredited programs in Kansas. The LCC Diagnostic Medical Sonography program submitted its application for accreditation to The Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education Programs (CAAHEP) in June 2012. The Commission completed a site visit on September 4th, 2012 and granted full accreditation in March 2013 for five years (through 2018).

The first cohort of seven students started in August 2011. Five of the seven graduated and all five passed the first registry exam. There are a total of four registry exams for the program. Of the first cohort, only two took all four registry exams. The curriculum has since been restructured and streamlined so that students complete two or three of the four registry exams prior to graduation.

A. Program Relation to College Mission, Core Values, and Strategic Plan

Labette Community College provides quality learning opportunities in a supportive environment for success in a changing world.

B. Program Recognition/Accreditation

The Diagnostic Medical Sonography program was awarded accreditation March, 2013. The next site visit will be 2018.

C. Program/Discipline Demand/Need

Diagnostic Medical Sonographers and cardiovascular technologists and technicians, including vascular technologists, operate special imaging equipment to create images or conduct tests. The images and test results help physicians assess and diagnose medical conditions. Some technologists assist physicians and surgeons during surgical procedures. Most diagnostic imaging professionals are employed in hospitals while others are employed in healthcare settings such as physician's offices and medical and diagnostic laboratories.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, employment is expected to grow 39% from 2012-22, much faster than average because of the increasing demand for sonography services. The job prospects for DMS are expected to be very good.

Tammy Kimrey, adjunct instructor, is certified in radiology, and three modalities in sonography. She is currently working to obtain her bachelor's degree. Joni Scott teaches online as an adjunct instructor. She is a Registered Nurse, a radiology tech, and is certified in three sonography modalities.

E. Faculty Recognition

Brian has shared his expertise in business entrepreneurship and marketing with LCC through several projects recently. He was the lead on the cafeteria fireplace remodel. The new charging station for phones, tablets, and computers will give the students a place to study, charge, and purchase food items. He is in the middle of the redesign of the bookstore. He is trying to create a low overhead with a higher profit margin. Brian has designed and is in the process of finishing the new signage for the Cardinal Café.

F. How Does the Discipline Use Professional Development?

The Society of Diagnostic Medical Sonography conference provides the latest technology, protocols, and updated material for the program director. He also attends the physics review conference with the students each year. The Perkins funding was used to purchase a mobile ultrasound machine. The machine will be used in lab.

J. Learning Resources

Are the learning resources adequate for the program/discipline teaching needs? Please provide comments.

Yes, The DMS Program is housed in new Zetmeir building. Sonography has its own space that allows the students to have lecture, computers, lab, and simulation all in one room. The director has an office off the class room to be available as needed to the students, and adjunct instructors. The majority of the equipment and supplies were purchased with the Title III grant monies. In 2015, John Winnie, Director of Radiology, on behalf of INTEGRIS Baptist Regional Hospital in Miami, Oklahoma, donated an ultrasound machine to the LCC Sonography program. In FY16, Perkins Grant funds were used to purchase a refurbished portable ultrasound machine. This purchase has been valuable to use not only in the lab but also for recruiting purposes. We use four ultrasound machines that allow real life scanning for training. The MedSim simulator was purchased by the Title III grant to allow students to practice a range of different situations. The simulator is a valuable tool for new students to get used to seeing normal anatomy. The student will see several different pathologies on the simulator that they might not see in ordinary scanning. This will limit the element of surprise if the student encounters them.

Discontinuance of Child Care and Support Services Management AAS degree and Child Care certificate

REASON FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE BOARD

Consideration is based on Policy and Procedure 3.34.

For the Child Care and Support Services Management AAS degree and Child Care certificate, the following apply: low enrollment in program courses, little demand for the program and certificate, and not in demand from area businesses.

BACKGROUND

There are four courses that are shared as concentration requirements for the Early Childhood Education AS degree and additional five courses that are shared as concentration or early childhood education elective courses. All of these courses will continue to be offered to support the Early Childhood Education AS degree. Lack of enrollment in the Child Care and Support Services Management AAS degree and Child Care certificate are primarily due to limited career options following completion. Enrollment in the Early Childhood Education AS degree is more advantageous because this credential allows graduates to be employed in paraprofessional positions with public elementary schools in addition to providing greater transferability for those graduates pursuing further education at a four-year institution. The AAS degree and certificate will both be discontinued immediately following board action as there are no students enrolled who will need to complete requirements.

PRESIDENT'S RECOMMENDATION

That the Board of Trustees approves the discontinuance of the Child Care and Support Services Management AAS degree and Child Care certificate.

Discontinuance of Child Care and Support Services Management AAS Degree

and Child Care Certificate

The following proposal presents information and data to support discontinuing the AAS degree and certificate in Child Care. Due to the circumstances outlined below, it is recommended that the resources currently divided between the Early Childhood Education AS degree and the Child Care and Support Services Management AAS degree be combined and used to support the Early Childhood Education AS degree.

A. The impact of the program closure on the mission of the college and on other academic/technical areas.

There has been little enrollment demand for the AAS degree and certificate as indicated by the low enrollment numbers reported to the Kansas Board of Regents (KBOR). Although we have not had to request conditional approval from KBOR yet due to substantive program revisions completed a couple of years ago, we are well below the enrollment threshold required for approval. KBOR allows new and substantively revised programs three years before they begin monitoring enrollment numbers. The minimum number of concentrators (students who have earned at least 12 credits in a CTE program) is an average of 8 per year using data from the most recent two years. In both AY14 and AY15, only one student was enrolled each year in the Child Care and Support Services Management AAS degree.

B. The strength and quality of the program and of its faculty.

The level of demand for this program is the best indicator of the overall strength and quality of the program. The AAS degree and certificate in Child Care do not lead to as many career choices and options as the Early Childhood Education AS degree. Therefore, few students are selecting either the AAS degree or certificate options. However, many of the courses are also required for the AS Early Childhood Education degree. There are 23 students currently enrolled with the AS Early Childhood degree as their declared major.

C. Any duplication of work done in the program by work done in other programs or departments.

The courses that are also required for the AS Early Education degree will need to be continued. Sharla Hopper will continue to receive a supplemental duty contract for advising and coordinating program activities for the Early Childhood Education degree. However, the amount of this contract will be reduced significantly because she will no longer be performing the duties required to support the Child Care degree and certificate.

D. Student Demand and projected enrollment in the program.

As stated in section A above, the number of students enrolled in the program has been below the threshold required by KBOR to be a Perkins approved program.
