Administrative Report

Budget Process and Budget Assumptions for 2016-2017

Vice-President Doherty reviewed the 2016-2017 budget assumptions with the Board. The revenue issues she addressed included dwindling state dollars, possible increase in tuition and fees, and lower property values. General price increases in paper, supplies, and utilities were discussed.

Comparison of expenditures to the budget – Leanna Doherty had placed the February financial report at the table. At the end of February we were 2/3 of the way through the year, the general fund was 66% expended and the technical education/vocational fund was 59% expended.

She invited questions from the Trustees and welcomed phone calls at a later date.

President's Report

Dr. Knox gave a short report.

Old Business (ACTION, INFORMATION OR DISCUSSION ITEMS)

Tuition and Fees 2016-2017

After a discussion about the increase of tuition and fees, Mrs. Zetmeir moved to approve a \$2 increase in tuition and \$2 increase in fees, for a total of a \$4 increase in all residency categories for the 2016-2017 school year. Mr. McReynolds seconded and a vote by a show of hands resulted in the motion failing 3-3. Mr. McReynolds, Mr. Hoskins, and Mrs. Zetmeir voted yes; Mr. Howerter, Mr. Winchell and Mr. Taylor voted no.

Mr. McReynolds moved to approve a \$1 increase in tuition and \$1 increase in fees, for a total of a \$2 increase in all residency categories for the 2016-2017 school year. Mrs. Zetmeir seconded and a vote by a show of hands resulted in the motion passing 4-2. Mr. McReynolds, Mr. Hoskins, Mr. Taylor and Mrs. Zetmeir voted yes; Mr. Howerter and Mr. Winchell voted no.

I. Basic Purpose of Position

Instructors' responsibilities encompass all courses assigned, committees assigned, or other activities required or agreed upon between faculty members and administration as specified in the LCC Master Agreement and LCC Policy/Procedures Manual. Instructors must demonstrate computer literacy in appropriate computer software and be able to demonstrate fluency in written and oral communications.

II. Essential Job Functions

- A. Ability to demonstrate knowledge of and commitment to effective teaching strategies, including active learning and methods to enhance student success at community colleges
- B. Ability to conduct all class sessions in a professional manner and exhibits good judgment and professional behavior
- C. Ability to develop and carry out testing/assessment plans in all courses taught that meets the criteria set forth by the Curriculum and Instruction Committee and the Outcomes Assessment Committee
- D. Ability to be available to advise students according to College policy
- E. Ability to maintain accurate records and reports and submit them in a timely manner to the appropriate person
- F. Ability to provide students with opportunities for community service and volunteerism as appropriate
- G. Ability to promote the general welfare of students and the college
- H. Ability to actively support the service area communities through service learning activities and projects as appropriate
- I. Ability to follow the master course syllabus and coordinate course outlines and book selections in accordance with established deadlines when faculty members teach different sections of the same course
- J. Ability to develop new courses as required by the administration
- K. Ability to develop and provide online instruction in discipline area as needed
- L. Ability to take the LCC Online Teaching course during the first year of teaching if appropriate

 - Master's degree or higher in the teaching discipline or related field; or
 - Successful completion of at least 18 graduate credit hours in the teaching discipline or related field, with a Bachelor's degree in the academic discipline/related field; or
 - Master's degree in an educational area (i.e. education, technology, curriculum and instruction, etc.) with a Bachelor's degree in the academic discipline/related field; or
 - In extenuating circumstances: Bachelor's degree in the teaching discipline or related field with at least three years of successful teaching experience at an accredited institution and currently teaching in a high school or college. Use of this standard required review and approval of the Vice President of Academic Affairs
- B. Faculty teaching in programs that are accredited or approved by outside agencies shall have teaching credentials that meet the standards specified by that agency.
- C. Faculty teaching non-transfer courses including Career Technical Education (CTE) courses, developmental or college preparation course, College Success Skills, continuing education workshops and workforce education courses must have an appropriate degree and/or credentials, special training, experience, creative production, or other accomplishments or distinctions appropriated to the discipline as determined by the Vice President of Academic Affairs.

SUBJECT

Restructuring of Physical Therapist Assistant Program Staff

REASON FOR CONSIDERATION BY THE BOARD

Kansas Statutes require Board of Trustees' approval of selected professional staff positions.

Procedure 10.04 Hiring states: Hiring of administration, faculty and professional staff members is ultimately subject to review and approval by the Board.

BACKGROUND

CAPTE, the accrediting organization for PT/PTA programs, requires that training programs meet the following staffing requirements:

1. Full-time Program Director
2. A second full-time position is required and may be either the Clinical Coordinator or a full-time faculty member.
3. Clinical Coordinator: may be part-time if there is a full-time faculty member.
4. Core Faculty: comprised of program director, clinical coordinator, and one additional person (may be adjunct or part-time faculty if the clinical coordinator is employed full-time).

The full-time Program Director was filled in January of this year. In early January, we began advertising to fill a full-time Clinical Coordinator position and have not been successful in filling the position. If we are successful in hiring the full-time faculty member, we would then need to hire a part-time Clinical Coordinator to meet the CAPTE staffing requirements. While recruiting for the full-time Clinical Coordinator position, we had a number of inquiries from qualified individuals who were only interested in a part-time position. If approved, this position would not be filled until the full-time faculty position is filled.

The Board of Trustees approve the new faculty position and authorize the start of a search for this position.





